1. Please describe why you would like to participate in an internship program in Israel and how you will use this experience to enhance your long-term goals and your academic career.

6. The program fee for the ten-week summer program will be \$1500; this will cover orientation, housing, travel expenses to and from Israel, two four-day educational tours and some group activities. If accepted to the program, you will receive a fellowship covering the remainder of the costs for the program. Do you need further funding in order to participate in this program? If yes, please list how much funding you will require. The Glazer Institute is willing to provide a limited number of need-based scholarships.
7. If chosen for the next step(s) in the application and/or acceptance process, you will need to be available for two rounds of interviews and a full-day orientation. First-round interviews will take place **January 10-12, 2012**; second-round interviews will take place **January 18-19**. Please bring another copy of your most recent unofficial transcript. If accepted into the program, a mandatory orientation will take place on **Saturday, March 24**. If you have any conflicts with these dates, please indicate so here.
