## HOW DOES IT WORK?

Place recyclable materials in the blue mixed recycling bins found in classrooms and residence hall common areas. Dispose of all other items in a trash bin.

## WHAT GOES IN THE RECYCLING BIN?



### Paper

Clean paper including printer paper, newspapers, magazines, books, junk mail, and paper grocery bags



### Glass

Glass bottles and jars of all colors, shapes, and sizes



### Plastic

Plastic bottles and containers, takeout containers, plastic grocery bags, milk jugs, and soap bottles



### Metal

Metal or aluminum food and beverage containers and clean foil



### Cardboard

Clean cardboard including flattened boxes, folders, cereal boxes, unlined milk containers, and pizza boxes with liners removed
